#### Year 6 Swimming Ability

Year 6 pupils take part in swimming lessons at Kings Hall Swimming Pool, Hackney for the Summer term.

The information below is based on the outcomes of the 2021-2022 cohorts' results:

- 49% of the children were able to swim at least 25 meters unaided by the end of the term
- 15 children were able to use a range of these strokes effectively
- 15 children were able to perform safe-self-rescue in different water-based situations.
