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# COFFEE MORNING ON LEAP EMPOWERMENT CURRICULUM

Parents attending this week's session on Wednesday were introduced to the Coffee Morning team with **Latisha** (our new Pastoral Support Manager) and **Hira** (a regular Coffee Morning parent but now a member of staff too!) and our ever reliable **Debs**!

Evelyn, our headteacher led a discussion about the strengths of the whole school community - and many parents commented on the family feel of the school and it's open door approachable culture..

Evelyn then gave a presentation about the LEAP Empowerment Curriculum, explaining how and why it came about. She explained our rich and relevant curriculum and how we have worked hard to make sure it represents our diverse community with a focus on children having high aspirations and role models. We discussed in length that black history is now incorporated into our History curriculum throughout the year (rather than just being a special focus month). You can find out more about the LEAP Empowerment Curriculum here. Evelyn also shared Kingsmead's Enrichment offer with parents and emphasised the importance of maintaining free access to breakfast club, activity hour clubs, trips, workshops and many other enrichment experiences.

There was also a discussion about the wider school community and the school events that bring us all together, such International Evening and Summer Fair. There was lots of very positive feedback about our recent International Evening and how proud everyone feels about belonging to such a strong community.

We also had a good conversation about the importance of Parent Voice and asked those present to think about a Parent Group name for the Coffee Morning regulars and also what future workshop and coffee morning sessions they would like to have. Some of the things that were suggested were How to navigate the school website, Supporting Behaviour at Home, and Maths strategies to support children at home. If you have any other ideas for a Coffee Morning session focus please let Debs know.
