CREATIVITY WEEK AT LEAP

For creativity week this year schools across LEAP have been looking closely at two paintings. The first was chosen by The National Gallery as part of their Take One Picture project and it is called 'A Courtyard in Delft' by Pieter de Hooch. The second is by Nigerian Artist Uzo Egonu titled 'Northern Nigerian Landscape'. Through these two paintings pupils have been learning about architecture, pattern, contrast and the differences between homes, across cultures and through passages of time.

Pupils have been developing a range of skills, from observational drawing to printing and pattern design, collage and construction of 3D models. They have been learning about 'Dutch Golden Age Painting' which signified a time of prosperity and a break with monastic traditions, as well as the life of the artist Pieter de Hooch, who was fascinated by human stories, light and

architecture. This is a painting which evokes lots of questions, such as: what is the woman in the background looking at? What is in the little girl's apron and who are the women in the picture? Children have enjoyed coming up with their own responses to these questions.

The second painting by Egonu invites us to look at Nigerian landscape and the textures and patterns that exist within it. Some of the activities in response to this work

have

included frottage, stencilling and printing. The tree, which winds its way past the towing city scape reminds us of nature's dominance. The way in which Egonu plays with perspective by stacking the houses and how he

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FAMILY COACH PARENT GROUP AT MANDEVILLE

The Family coach service are running a Parent Empowerment group consisting of 5 sessions at Mandeville Primary School with a focus on Increasing Confidence and Reducing Stress. These sessions are free and are for families with children who have special educational needs (in any of the 4 areas of SEN: sensory & physical, cognition & learning, communication & interaction or social, emotional and mental health). No formal diagnosis or EHCP required. The sessions will be on Tuesdays from 9—10am but Rachel said the group are happy to wait for Kingsmead parents to walk over from Kingsmead after dropping their children at 8.50am so if you can't get there till a few minutes after 9am that's fine! The first session starts on Tuesday 27th February. Spaces are limited—only 10 available, for Kingsmead and Mandeville families.
