LEAP SCHOOL COUNCILS

On Monday the School Councillors from Gayhurst, Kingsmead and Mandeville met to discuss an exciting joint project. The children met with Jessie Mond Wedd, a legal consultant for Lawyers for Nature. They found out about the '**We are Nature**' project which wants to change the dictionary definition of 'Nature' to include humans.

The school council listened to why this was important, how humans are connected to nature, how we can protect it more and how we can get involved.

The school councillors plan to deliver an assembly in their LEAP school, following a discussion with the Headteacher. They will be asking the children across LEAP, 'How do you define nature?' Children are able to respond to the question in the form of a drawing, a poster, a story, a poem, or by writing their own definition.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

We hope this information from NHS England is helpful:

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school or nursery when they're unwell.

Coughs and colds: It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold.

Sore throat: You can still send your child to school if they have a sore

throat.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school on the first day they are off. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.



BOOKING YOUR PARENTS CONSULTATION SLOT

We are using a different system to book parents slots for the upcoming Parent Consultation sessions that will take place on **Thursday 14**



March from 2pm onwards. Kingsmead are now using Arbor for booking parents consultation appointment times and we have set up accounts for parents.

You will need to access this Arbor account, to book a slot for our parent/carer evening on Thursday 14 March 2pm –6pm. You will not be able to book a time slot, unless you access the parent account on Arbor.

- You need to register on Arbor using your email that we have listed on our system. You can do this by following the instructions below.
- To finish creating your account, you just need to set a password. You can do this by going to <u>login.arbor.sc.</u> clicking on '**Forgotten Password?**' and following the instructions on screen.
- Your username is your email
